

ALEXIS METALLINOS

(b. 1991, Corfu, Greece)

Alexis Metallinos is a folk guitarist, singer, and composer whose work bridges Mediterranean traditions with improvisation and jazz influences.

He has performed on stages such as Stockbridge Parish Church and The Speakeasy – Scots Royal Club (Edinburgh), Music Diaries Festival (Thessaloniki), Nakas Conservatory (Athens), Lendwirbel Festival (Graz), the Edinburgh Fringe, Seven Festival (Corfu Old Fortress), Theater am Lend, and Kremlino (Piraeus)

His soundtrack for the UNESCO-recognized film Honor Crimes received awards at three international film festivals, six semifinalist placements, and more than twenty nominations. He also earned second place performing in Spianada Square for Corfu's "Best Youth Band" competition, and was recognized as "Artist of the Day" on Menta 88 radio.

Alexis is a three-time scholarship recipient from the Ionian Conservatory of Northern Corfu, holds a Jazz Guitar diploma from the Philippos Nakas Conservatory, and studied Flamenco guitar in Seville, Spain. He has represented Corfu both at the Island Innovation Summit 2021 and the Aqua Jazz International Festival.

For the past three years, he has been teaching private guitar lessons online while traveling between Greece, Austria, and Scotland for public and private performances. With over 10 years of professional experience, he has also built a strong career performing at private events and professional engagements—including bars, restaurants, hotels, weddings, and special occasions—bringing his unique style of music to diverse audiences.

He has also released original works over the past decade, including Witch's Curse, Βρέχει Φώς, and Live στο Αμάξι, which showcase his distinctive blend of Mediterranean folk, jazz, and improvisation.
