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Nikos Gkikas was born in Athens, Greece, in 1975. He works as a freelance writer, editor and translator. As a child, he over-passed kids-literature and straightly entered adult-fiction through Agatha Christie's, Alfred Hitchcock's and Edgar Alan Poe's work. Inspired to be a rule-breaking filmmaker, he studied screenwriting rules by the side of Antonis Kehagias, (freelancer story-teller and screenwriter in *Columbia Pictures* and *Instituto delle Scienze Cinema ed Audovisive, Florence*) during a 24 months course (2001-2002).

On the other hand, he kept his literary spirit alive, writing over a dozen novels and many short stories, some of them published in Greek websites and blogs, all inspired by "the classics", regarding plot and writing style.

He has worked as a beta reader for Livanis Publications (June 2019 – December 2020).

He was the editor, when "Chasing the Dead" (Tim Weathers) arrived in Greek literature market, for Bell Editions (March 2020).

He published his first novel in "The murderer's last will" on November 1st 2019, in Greece. The book took many boffo reviews and still does, as time passes by. This is the first part of a crime fiction trilogy and the story of an "about-to die" detective, who's called to solve an unusual mystery: a man commits suicide and announces -through his "Testament and Last Will"- his intention to kill his son-in law during the next few hours.

The novel has been, finally, translated in English and has been rewritten as a script, a smooth adaptation "knocking on Heaven's door": the Film Industry.

His play "Flatiron" was published in June 2021 by Papadimitropoulos Editions, followed by another, "The Great Vesper", in November 2022.
